### **Clinical Description**

- The clinical experience will introduce the student to the acute care setting.
- The student will build upon assessment, communication skills, medication administration and professional standards of safety to provide patient-centered care.
- The student will collaborate with the patient, family and healthcare team and utilize informatics in data collection, interpretation of lab results, and documentation.
- Simulated clinical experiences provide opportunities for students to link course concepts to the application of critical thinking, priority setting, clinical judgement, and clinical reasoning through use of the nursing process.

## **Clinical Objectives**

- A. Demonstrate patient-centered care of adult patients from diverse backgrounds utilizing evidence-based practice and informatics to support clinical decision making.
  - 1. Patient-centered care
    - a. Perform a focused assessment of adults experiencing common health problems with predictable outcomes in acute care settings.
    - b. Contribute to the development of individualized patient-centered plans of care for adults experiencing common health problems with predicable outcomes in acute care settings.
    - c. Provide culturally sensitive care to individuals and families from diverse populations in acute care settings.
    - d. Identify opportunities to advocate for adults regarding nursing care issues.
    - e. Use verbal and nonverbal communication that promotes caring, therapeutic relationships with adults and their families.
    - f. Use current evidence-based practices in the provision of patient-centered care to support clinical decision making.
    - g. Use informatics to securely and accurately document the provision and outcome of patient care.
    - h. Use informatics to communicate with other members of the health care team.

- B. Participate as members of the healthcare team and identify opportunities for continuity of patient care and quality improvement.
  - 2. Teamwork and Collaboration
    - a. Participate as a member of the health care team in the provision of patient-centered care.
    - b. Communicate patient related information to designed members of the healthcare team in a timely manner.
    - c. Identify patient care concerns related to quality care.
    - d. Participate in activities to promote quality improvement.
- C. Practice physiological and psychosocial principles to provide safe nursing care while utilizing the nursing process.
  - 3. Safety
    - a. Identify actual and potential safety risks in the health care environment.
    - b. Identify actions that promote safe practice and a safe environment for patients, self, and others.
- D. Practice professionalism consistent with legal and ethical standards that promote the profession of nursing.
  - 4. Professionalism
    - a. Practice nursing in accordance with standards of practice, and healthcare facility policies and procedures.
    - b. Use an established Nursing Code of Ethics, the Patient Bill of Rights, and the Self Determination Act as a framework for practice.
    - c. Maintain professional accountability in the delivery of patient care.
